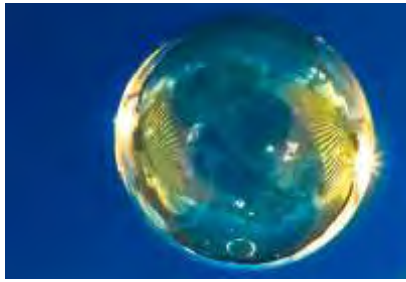


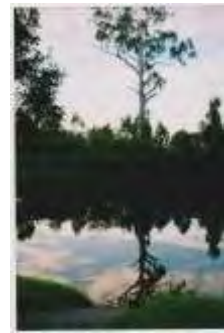
BASS COAST CAMERA CLUB NEWSLETTER JUNE/JULY 2014

Here are a couple of useful tips for our Depth of Field Challenge. A. On your camera, choose the lowest aperture. B. Get as close as you can to the subject. Bring your photos in to our next session, which is on Sat. 19th July for Show & Tell.

At our next session, Shelley will be showing us some techniques for creating Macro Photography. Please bring in some interesting small items for us to set up displays. Also, bring in anything that will form a suitable background. i.e. pieces of material, coloured/crinkled paper. Use your imagination. We can use lighting to create highlights and shadows. The more display areas we have the more interesting the workshop will be since you will need to adjust your cameras quite a bit. It is all meant to be fun so join in and see what we can create.

We had two suggestions for our sessions in August and September. In August, we could go along to the Desal Plant to the outside nature Reserve for a photo shoot and in September we could go along to Kilcunda for lunch and then a photo shoot. We could meet at the Goods Shed then pool cars. Dependant on the weather, being kind to us.
